Medals will be given 1st through 4th place for each of the events listed above at the end of the season at the Mentor Sunshine Invitational in July.

Points

- There will be no more than 6 skaters in a group.
- Skaters will receive 3 points for each level they move up with a maximum of 6 points received per season.
- Points will be applied in the following way:
 - The skater who places 1st will receive 6 points
 - The skater who places 2nd will receive 5 points
 - The skater who places 3rd will receive 4 points
 - The skater who places 4th will receive 3 points
 - The skater who places 5th will receive 2 points
 - The skater who places 6th will receive 1 point
 - If there is only 1 skater in the group then the maximum points given is 3.
 - If there are 2 skaters in a group then the skater that places 1st will receive 3 points and the skater that places 2nd will receive 2 points.
- Winners of each event of the series will need to move up to the next level to be eligible for upcoming season.
